Student/Familie	Student Development Days (Mental Health Awareness Days)	
S	Student Development Day, held on Friday, November 15th, provided an enriching opportunity for students to focus on balancing stress with engaging and restorative activities. The day featured a variety of wellness initiatives, including arts and crafts, rest and relaxation sessions, and a Silent DJ music party, offering students an enjoyable escape from academic pressures. Games, sports activities, and community drumming sessions further contributed to fostering teamwork, physical activity, and mindfulness. These interactive events were designed to help students manage stress while enhancing their social connections and overall well-being. Additionally, the day allowed students the flexibility to catch up on missed academic work, ensuring that their educational needs were still met alongside their personal growth.	
	Block 37 Fall 2024 Block 37's after-school program, which began with 54 students, successfully concluded its 8-week session on Thursday, November 14th, with 36 students completing the program. Over the course of the program, these students earned more than 2,100 internship hours and collectively brought in over \$24,000 in salaries. The program provided valuable hands-on work experience, equipping students with skills while keeping them safe in fun engaging activities. Despite some attrition, the accomplishments of the participants highlight the impact of the program.	

Discipline	 SY '23-24 – DLS had a total of out of school suspensions of 161 incidents. This resulted in an average of 16 suspension incidents per month. Our goal is to reduce suspensions by 25% in an effort to reclaim more learning time for students. We had 12 suspensions for the month of October.
