KCIA earned an annual performance report score of 73.6% for the 2021-2022 school year. DESE publicly released scores in March.

How did we do?

We are so excited to share that KCIA has earned a score of 73.6% -- this categorizes our school as “**accredited**”! A top highlight of this report is the points our school earned for academic growth. The students at KCIA are making **above-average academic progress** and growing faster than similar kids at other schools in Missouri. We earned 96.7% of possible growth points in math and 85.8% of growth points in ELA, a **growth score that is higher than most other schools in the state**.

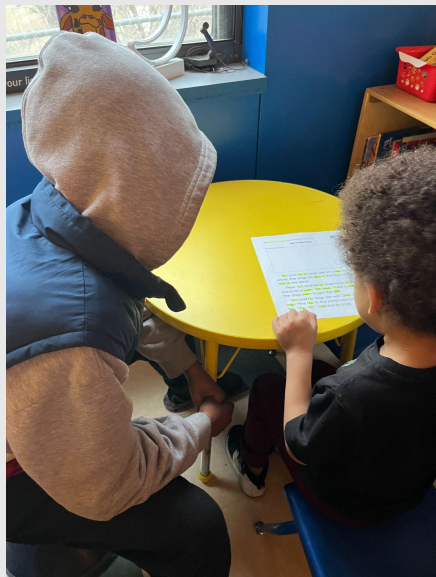
World Cultures Night

Students and staff were so excited for the return of our annual World Cultures Night after a hiatus during the pandemic. We had so much fun eating, dancing, playing and crafting.



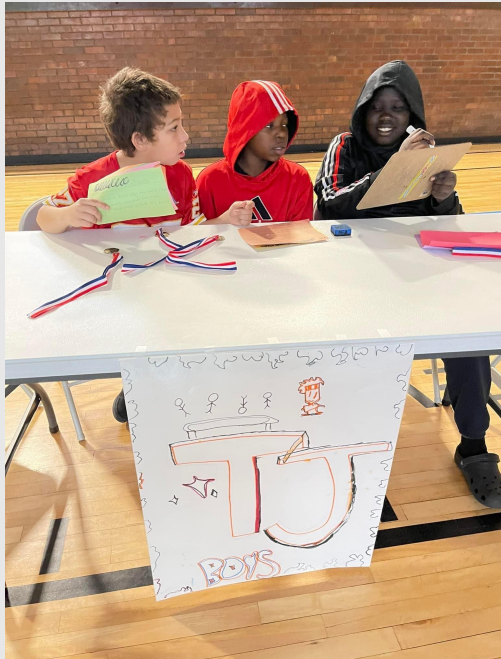
Reading Buddies

Battle of the Books

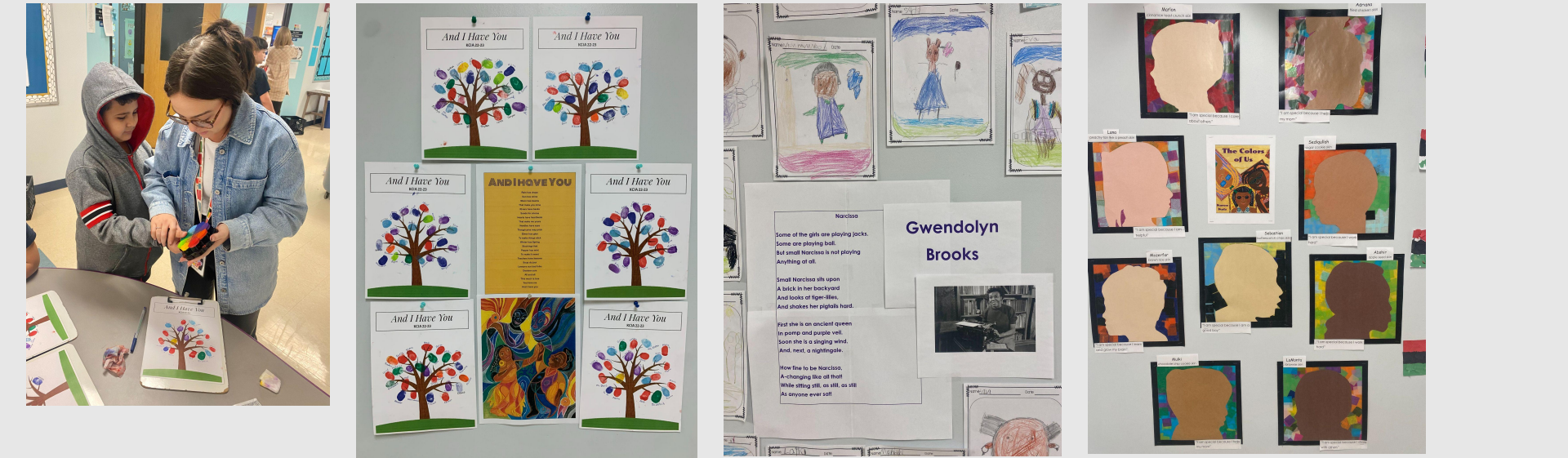
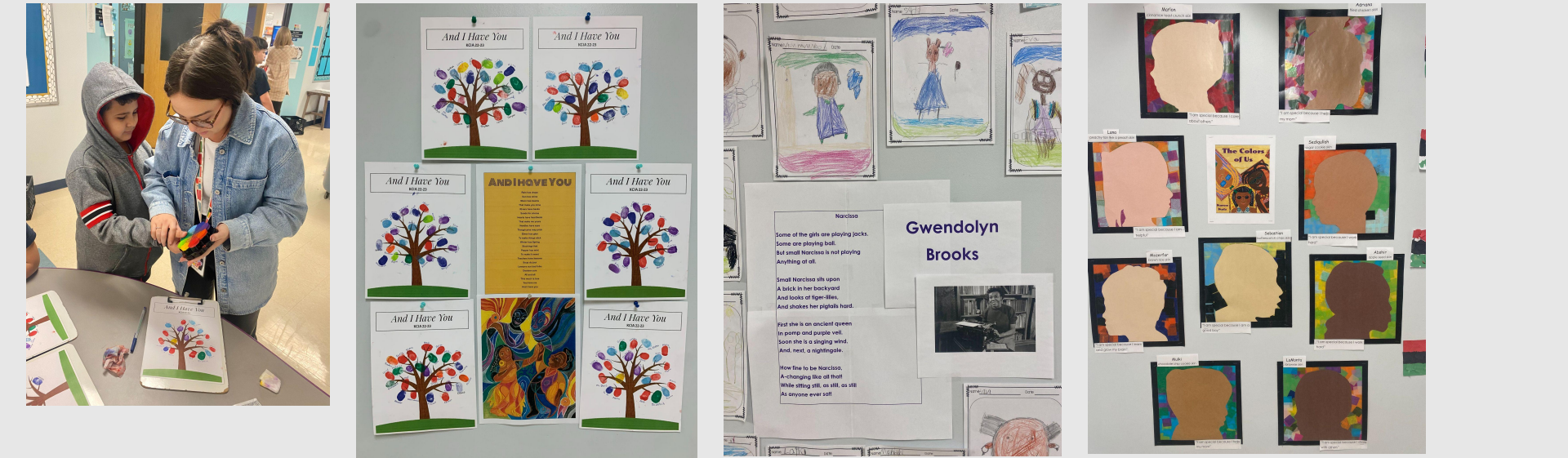
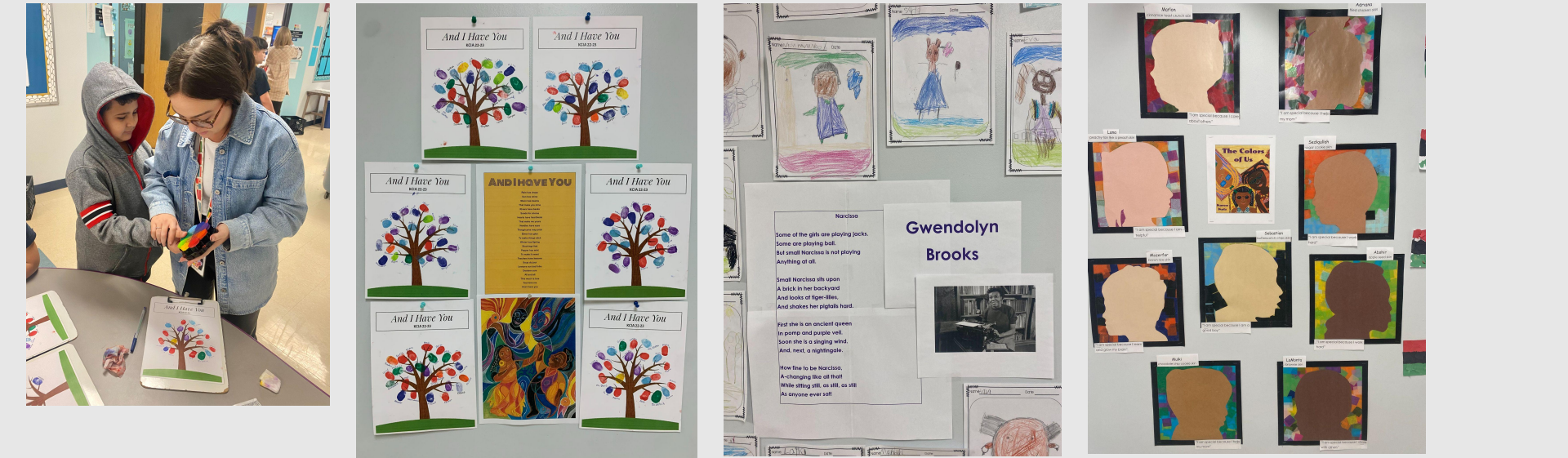
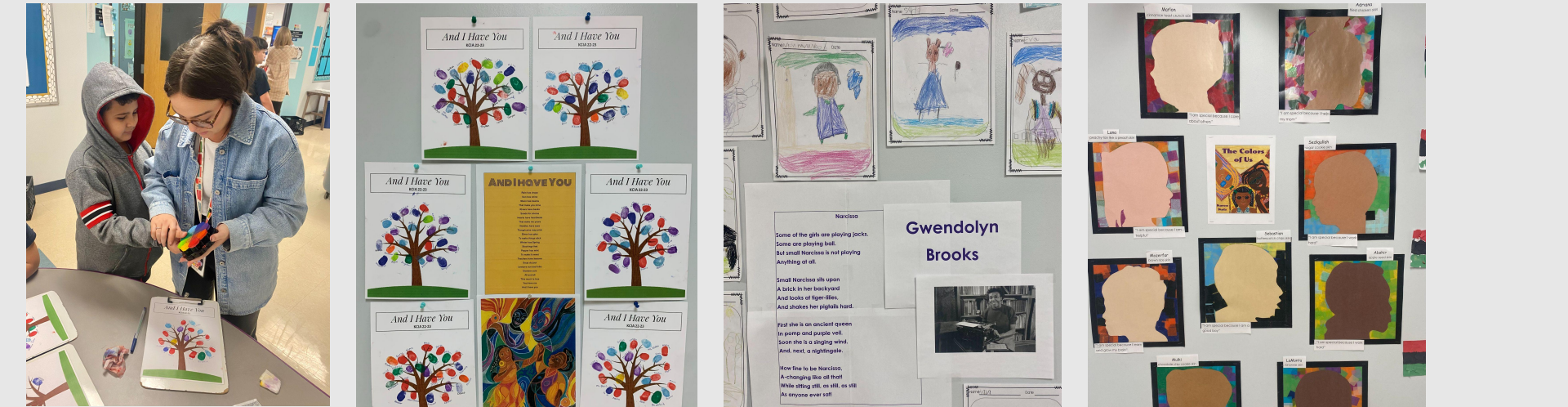
