Enrollment Numbers: Region: 1,024 / Endeavor Campus: 655 / Legacy Campus: 369

Total Enrollment Growth

- May 2024 (Last Day of School): 809 students (combined total for both campuses).
- August 12, 2024 (First Day of Class): 987 students (combined total for both campuses).
- Current Enrollment (12/09/24): 1,024 students (combined total for both campuses).
- Growth:
 - May → August: +178 students (22% increase).
 - August → Current: +37 students (3.7% increase).
 - Total Growth (May → Current): +215 students (26.6% increase).

Overall Attendance Trends (08/12/2024 - 12/09/2024)

- Total Enrollment: 723 students at KIPP Endeavor Academy and 401 students at KIPP Legacy High School between first day of classes and 12/09/24.
- Overall Attendance Rate:
 - Endeavor Academy: 86.26%
 - Legacy High School: 84.40%

Highest Attendance (each campus)

• **5th Grade**: 90.76%

• **12th Grade**: 85.26%

Minimum Attendance Benchmark: 85% // Exceeding Expectations Benchmark: 95%



Student Attendance, Retention & Enrollment Executive Summary

Enrollment Numbers: Region: 1,024 / Endeavor Campus: 655 / Legacy Campus: 369

Positive Trends:

- **Enrollment Growth**: KIPP schools have shown enrollment growth from May to the first day of school, with a significant increase in the total student counts.
- **High Attendance Rates in Lower Grades**: Grades PK–5 show relatively high attendance rates, with an average daily attendance (ADA) of over 85%, especially in grades 5 and K, with ADA above 88%.
- Consistent Attendance in Higher Grades at Legacy: While ADA drops slightly at KIPP Legacy High School, attendance is still relatively strong, with grades 9–12 maintaining ADA above 83%, though further improvements are needed.

Academics Executive Summary

Student Attendance, Retention, and Enrollment:

- Enrollment Growth: Significant increase in student enrollment from May to December 2024:
 - O May → Current: +215 students (+26.6% growth).
- Attendance Trends:
 - Endeavor Academy: 86.26% (highest in 5th grade: 90.76%).
 - Legacy High School: 84.40% (highest in 12th grade: 85.26%).
- **Positive Highlights**: Strong attendance in lower grades (PK–5) and consistent retention in higher grades despite room for improvement.

2024 APR Results:

- **3-Yr Composite:** 39.6%
- **Total Points Earned:** 49.5 out of 154 = 32%

Academic Talent & Engagement:

- **Teacher Certification and Training**: Leveraging DESE's resources for monitoring teacher qualifications, continuous training, and proactive compliance efforts.
- Staff Development: Implementing internal monitoring and communication to support educator readiness.


Governance & Compliance Executive Summary


