Our January test administration is our second of three standards-aligned interims that assess progress toward mastery of grade-level content.

How did we do?

33% of KCIA students in grades 2-8 will meet grade-level proficiency expectations on the ANet assessments.

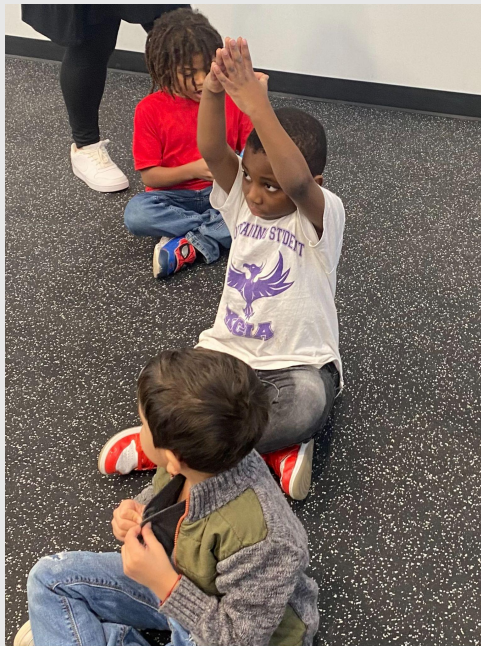
LETRS Training

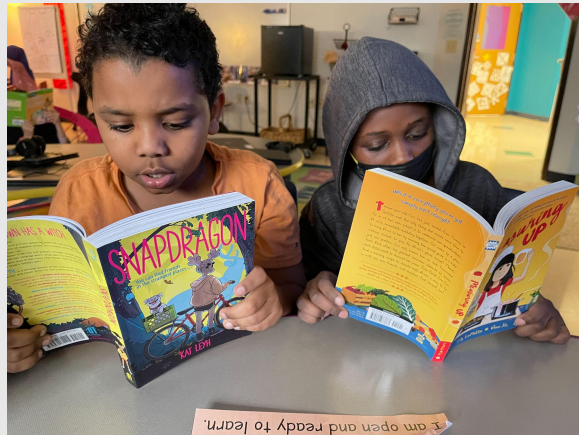
New Activity Room

PE classes have officially begun in the new activity room! Check out our kindergarteners enjoying this new space.



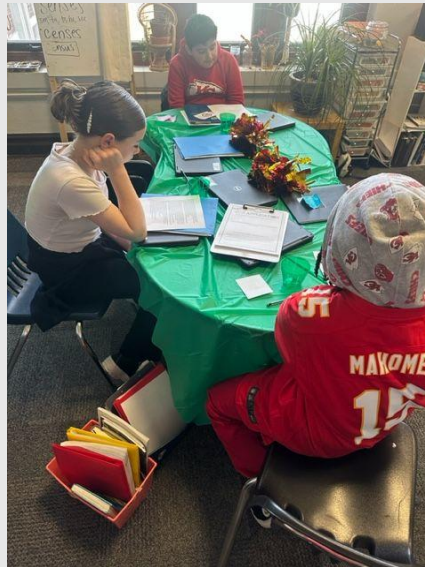
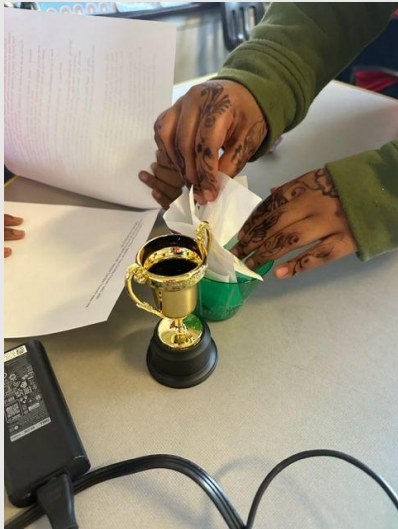
Battle of the Books

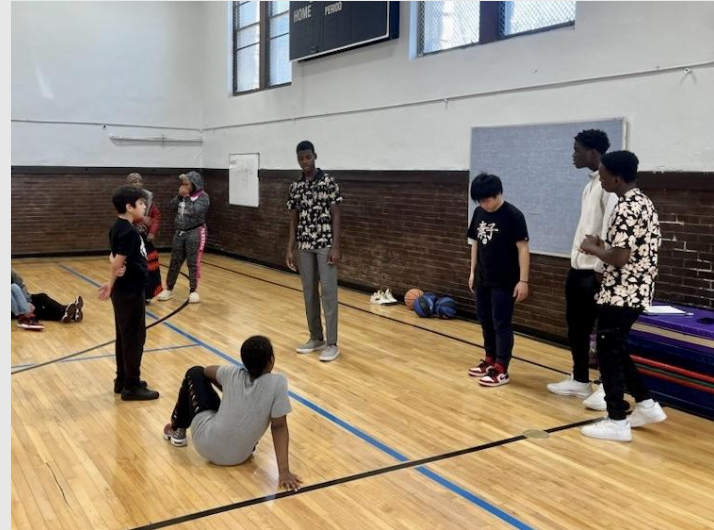
Draft Day
