

- Current best forecast for 24-25 enrollment: 190




## Public School Enrollment

#### 5th Grade Enrollment - KC Public & Charter




The number of 5th graders enrolled in public schools in Kansas City has decreased by over 8% since pre-pandemic.

## Charter School Enrollment



After increasing pre-pandemic as a result of charter schools opening or expanding, the number of 5th graders enrolled in charter schools in Kansas City decreased by over 6% post-pandemic.

### Charter Market Saturation




Nearly 60% of KC charter schools are under-enrolled in the 5th grade.

Others have decreased the number of available seats, including KCGPA.

Broader headwinds behind this: declining birth rates and families moving out of KC.

Educator shortages started before, but were exacerbated by, the pandemic.

The ratio of hires to job openings has been below 1 since 2017, dipping almost to 0.5 in recent years (e.g. for every 100 teacher job openings in 2022, roughly 55 were filled).
