



The FACE Team worked together to update our caseloads and have begun reaching out to our students and families. We have made sure that students have backpacks, supplies, hygiene products, clothing and new shoes. We have ensured that families have food and household supplies. Within the first week of school I helped two families in the Caring Closet and Food Pantry.

I met with leaders from NorthPoint Development to discuss their continued support of KCIA students and families. One of their goals is to increase mentor relationships with more of our students. They are committed to helping us reach the students that need extra support. This is an amazing opportunity for our students and their families.

One of my families volunteers at a local food pantry in the community where many of our students reside. She and the leaders at the pantry have agreed that supporting KCIA families is a benefit to the families AND the community and have agreed to share food with us. I picked up the first batch of food to assess if families would come to the school to pick it up. We had apples, plums, potatoes, peppers, tomatoes and peaches. We posted on social media and the fresh fruits and vegetables were all picked up with an hour! I will be sure to get extra next time as the need is there and our families will come.

This past January at School Saturday, I met with a family who was in the beginning stages of adoption. They were being proactive and looking at schools before an adoption took place. I talked with them about KCIA and they seemed very interested. Fast forward to Back to School Night, I recognized them from School Saturday and asked if they had adopted a child. They excitedly reported that they were finalizing their adopting and had enrolled their son at KCIA. How awesome is this?!
