

Some context:

- State law requires DESE to issue their Annual Performance Report (APR) of all LEAs and buildings, including charter schools. FY23 was released in December.
- What is the APR? It is a tool used by DESE when making accreditation decisions. Charters are NOT accredited.
- **Instead**, charters are held accountable to a their sponsor's performance framework and performance contract. The Commission includes APR data in our Annual Report.
- AFIA is a PK-6th grade LEA, so there are some elements that appear on a PK-12 APR that do not appear on AFIA's report. Thus, you can't easily compare APRs against one another.

- There are multiple literacy interventions happening across all grade levels, these include, but are not limited to:
 - Literacy Lab in primary grades: Funded by SSKC grant
 - Hoot tutoring: We are able to add additional slots for this due to a literacy grant we received in partnership with Turn the Page KC.
 - Orton-Gillingham: Some of these interventions are being taught by a trained volunteer.
 - Systematic Phonics: Some of these interventions are being taught by volunteers.

*Context: If a local education agency (LEA) implements an AMI Plan that is approved by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), the LEA is not required to make up school Hours (up to 36 hours) that were lost or cancelled due to exceptional or emergency circumstances (see Section 171.033, RSMo). LEAs must assure that the plan will favorably affect teaching and learning to receive DESE approval. LEAs are required to submit an AMI Plan for each school year of implementation.
