

They visit me every morning before school but the week of the pacer test, they visited and also did stretching and push ups to be prepared for the test. They told me that you can never be too prepared for PE.

We have all been busy with the daily requests for student's needs and family needs. To help families visit the Caring Closet and Food Pantry a little easier, we opened up appointments for our full PD Day on the 21st. 2 of my families came and stocked up on clothing and groceries.

I attended the McKinney-Vento Coop meeting this month.
