Notes:

We are currently projecting a fund balance in excess of \$500,000. However, considering the uncertainties around our future, we do have the capacity to utilize an additional \$700,000 of ESSER III funds that we were planning to use in 2023-24. This would insure that the Federal funds get utilized and stay in Kansas City.

Revenue

A. Contributions - Foundations/Business: This line is below budget because we reclassified the funding from the Children's Services Fund of Jackson County to the County line. Conversely, the County Revenue line is over budget.

Expense

- B. Contracted Services: The overage in this line is due primarily to the increase in payments to summer school providers. When the state increased our funding per student, it also increased the funding we pass through to our summer school contractors. We did increase this line in December, but not sufficiently. Additionally we have increased our investment with partners in efforts to improve our educational outcomes.
- C. Legal Expenses: Our revised budget was approved in December before we received notice from our sponsor that they were going to revoke our charter.

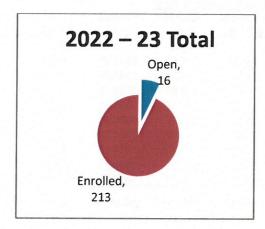

Genesis School Statement Regarding Appeal

On February 23rd, the Genesis School Board voted to appeal to the State Board of Education the (MCPSC) decision to Revoke Genesis Charter, effective June 30th 2023. It is unfortunate that Commissioners made an arbitrary decision to violate their contract with Genesis, attempting to close the school. The Board further committed to pursuing all available remedies to continue to serve the community as a public charter school, including appealing MCPSC decision to the State Board. The appeal was submitted on March 21st and is available on our website. Genesis looks forward to a fair review of the facts by State Board members, that includes:

- Closing Genesis is not supported by the data. A fair analysis of Genesis data during the contract clearly shows improved academic performance, in contrast with state and local post pandemic trends. Genesis met the conditions approved by the State Board at renewal in 2020, despite the pandemic. Since 2020, Genesis academic results show both growth and improvement, despite an unprecedented pandemic. Growth and improvement from pre-pandemic levels is not common within KC, the state or the nation. Genesis presentation to the commission is available on our website.
- Closing Genesis is in violation of the contract between the Commission and the Board. Genesis just transferred to the Commission in January of 2022 and signed a new contract in July of 2022, extending the school's charter with the commission to 2025. Genesis has not violated the contract and there is no new academic data available since the contract was signed. At a minimum, the Commission entered into the contract in bad faith. The Charter school system can't operate if contracts between schools and sponsors are not upheld.
- The Process followed by the Commission is not consistent with the law. MCPSC became the Sponsor of Genesis in January of 2022. Commissioners first vote regarding any action with Genesis was the vote this month to close the charter. Processes in statute governing charter schools mandate schools and sponsors work progressively to constantly improve, with transparent benchmarks. These processes were not available to Genesis.
- Eliminating Genesis from the KC public education landscape is not supported by the community. Despite Commission staff's attempts to defame the organization during this process, Genesis enjoys strong support from the community, local elected officials and multiple community partners. This arbitrary decision was made by a state agency governed by Commissioners from throughout the state, with no attempt at interaction or observation of the school, students, families, or the board. Three commissioners didn't even travel to Kansas City for the hearing and two didn't even attend remotely. Other choices that the Commissioners from outside of KC seem to believe are better choices for Genesis students and families are available to families now, but they choose Genesis. Strong evidence of support from families and partners was provided to attending Commissioners during the hearing and in writing and apparently was not considered.
- Closing Genesis is not in the best interest of the students and families that Genesis serves. The Charter statute requires sponsors of charter schools to sponsor schools that serve an at-risk population. Genesis has always required a sponsor who not only holds them to high academic expectations, but also works in tandem with the board to determine appropriate measures for evaluating performance. The Commission has refused to look at the comparison data of the mutually agreed upon peer schools nor even meet with the board. The Commission was invited to a board off-site in November and declined. In the best interests of our families, the Genesis board requested yet again to meet with Commissioners and mediate a resolution in the best interest of students on February 6th and the Commissioners denied the request, instead reiterating that Genesis should give up their charter.

Subject: Genesis School Letter of Interest (LOI) in Education Collaboration

Dear Dr. Jennifer Collier,

I am reaching out asking for your consideration of a request to collaborate. The Genesis Board strongly concurs with the KCPS board principle that "a coordinated and organized public education system" best meets the needs of KC students. Genesis already takes advantage of KCPS offer to collaborate, operating as a Tier II partner providing transportation to our students at a reduced cost. Recent developments with our current sponsor, the Missouri Charter Public School Commission (MCPSC) have made clear to us that coordination, collaboration and decisions are best made within Kansas City and we now seek further collaboration at the earliest opportunity.

As a non-profit academic institution, Genesis School has served educational needs of students in Kansas City since 1975. In 1999, the organization received one of the original Kansas City public charters. From the organization's inception, Genesis has strived to serve an at-risk population.

By statute, on January 1st of 2022 Genesis School was transferred to MCPSC as a sanction against our previous sponsor. We had no choice. Despite the Board's efforts to develop a shared vision of a charter school in KC that includes students behind in their academic journey, MCPSC Commissioners voted on February 15th to revoke Genesis Charter effective June 30th of 2023. Their decision was made despite clear evidence presented in public hearing that refuted MCPSC's claims in the presence of overwhelming community support (presentations and a recording of the hearing is available on our website). Our board has appealed the decision and received indications that we can anticipate a ruling from the State Board in April.

For a host of reasons, the Genesis board still believes continuing to serve as an inclusive public charter school is the best path forward for both the organization and the Kanas City landscape. Yet, even if we are successful in stopping this unfair and arbitrary process, continued sponsorship by MCPSC is not aligned to the core beliefs of our organization. We would be most interested in discussing KCPS as a new sponsor, should this be available to us through appeal or other legal options.

Closure Planning One-Pager

Closure Update: In order to act in the best interest of Genesis families and staff, the school is conducting prudent closure planning consistent with MCPSC policies. Our guidance is to continue to be transparent, perform those actions necessary to prevent harm to students and staff if we are required to close, while taking no actions that would cause irreparable harm to the 2023-24 school year.

MCPSC actions: Hired a closure coordinator, Ms. Dana Cutler to begin working with the school. Ms. Cutler has met with Board president, school leadership and conducted one closure transition team meeting.

Closure Transition Team: A team formed to coordinate closure. Consists of MCPSC Coordinator, MCPSC KC Representative, Genesis representatives including Executive Director, Registrar, Finance Director and HR Director. Board President is a member.

Closure Work is in 3 Phases:

Phase I: Now until end of School Year- May 25th

Phase II: May 25th- End of Fiscal Year - June 30th

Phase III: July 1st-September 30th - Close Out

Requirements are in four groups:

- Staffing: Closing out and transitioning employees

- Students/Families: Transitioning and providing records

- Finance: Meeting responsibilities and returning unspent State and Federal Dollars

Records: Student and organizational records need to be digitized and turned over.

Staffing: We have divided staff into categories by phase and provided notification of end of employment if we are closed. We have not provided offers of return for teachers, nor have we engaged in interviews for the 2023-24 school year.

Students and Families: We notified families of the Commission's decision in February and notified them of the application deadlines. We have not yet had parents sign up for reenrollment. We are working with Show-Me-KC schools and the Boys and Girls Club for a School Fair in May. If we are open for 2023-24, we will kick off reenrollment at the fair.

Finance: We have done initial work to determine our position on the amount of funds the organization would need to return to the State. A separate one-pager is provided. We have begun work on a closure budget. We have not created a 2023-24 year charter budget.

Records: We have reviewed the records requirements and are preparing a request for proposal to digitize records. Digitizing historical records is a good practice, whether we continue or not. The requirement is significantly less if the organization continues as a non-profit.
