Website Update (Dr. Stacy King) (Action)

- Proposal with MODI Creative
- The Challenge: KCIA's current WordPress (WP) website was built in Q1 of 2017. Industry standards recommend a site redesign/rebuild every 3-4 years
- The Solution: KCIA needs a website that serves as the primary digital hub for up-to-date information and resources. It needs to be intuitive to navigate and provide a platform where users can quickly and easily find what they need. Our recommendation is to create a brand-new WordPress website built on the Elementor framework.

Curriculum & Instruction Written Report (Kate McDowell)

- First Quarter Highlights: Teachers and staff have worked so hard during the first quarter of the school year and implemented many practices to support student learning
  - Third Grade Chefs: Students were surprised with chef costumes and pancakes, and their day's learning targets were tied to food. In math, students used measurement skills to make trail mix. In ELA, they focused on transition words and sentence elaboration in reading and writing about recipes.
- Future Scientists: KCIA adopted the resource Amplify Science in grades three, four and five for the first time this year (supported in part by a SchoolSmartKC grant) and dedicated a more substantial block of time to science education in our daily schedule.
- Hello, Library: Our library elective is back in elementary school! K-4 students attend the library as
  an elective/specials class weekly, allowing for students to check out books, build a love for
  reading, and focus on our state's standards for research.
- Friendship Classrooms: K-4 students launched their Friendship Rooms to build connections and relationships with peers across grade levels. Students are paired with a buddy in another classroom and will meet monthly to work together on a variety of topics throughout the year.

There are seven schools including KCIA still considering signing the MOU and participating in the Bond.

- November 8, 2024 is the hard KCPS deadline for committing to be a part of the Bond.
- Ongoing concerns expressed by our legal representation include:

o Lack of language that honors the \$50 million-dollar commitment regardless of the number of charter schools participating in the bond

o Lack of clear language that affirms participating charters can expand seats based on sponsor agreement

o Lack of clear language around how the interest earned on the \$50 million will be disbursed o Lack of language that establishes course of action if KCPS does not honor its commitment (language does exist for KCPS if charter schools do not honor the commitment)
