Finance Report

FY24 Financial Update

- We met 4/18 to review FY 25 budget, more on that on the next slide
 - We forecast the school's year ending cash balance to be around \$2.3m, basically in line with the budget, leaving 52 days cash on hand.
 - Attendance has improved some over the last couple of months
- Areas of emphasis for remainder of year:
 - Enrollment and attendance going in the 2024/2025 school year
 - Amanda McRae is going to provide an update on current enrollment status

FY25 Budget Update

• EdOps has projected budgeted revenue for FY25:

- FY25 budgeted revenue projection is \$15.8M (\$365k lower than FY24)
- Revenues are based on an end of year student count of 961 (12% under enrollment, 5% attrition)
- Loss of ESSER funding will result in a roughly a 2M decrease in revenue
- Local and State Revenue are projected to increase
 - WADA increase of \$1,100 to \$12,443/student
 - Addition of 12th Grade
- Potential upside: Projection does not include any private grants or donations
- The Finance Committee will continue to work with staff and EdOps to evaluate the expense side of the budget based on the revenue projections presented today.

- DESE is coming in May to audit special education financials and the team has been working with EdOps and Finance Committee to prepare for it.
