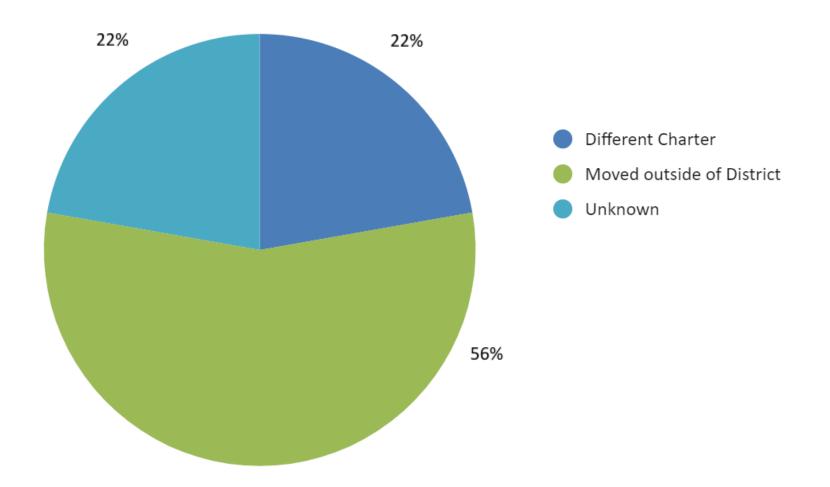

Call to Order and Roll Call

Board Chairman, Mrs. Katie Kwo Gerson called the board meeting officially to order at 4:06 p.m

Enrollment Report

Director of Admissions, Mrs. Cynthia Kivett opened her report confirming the total number of students currently enrolled is 1,081. During the time period of October 24, 2023 through November 15, 2023, there were 6 withdrawals; 3 students transferred to different Charter schools, 2 unknown, and 1 has moved out of district.

Finance Report

Chief Financial Officer, Mr. Tyler Kemp opened with the month ending for October 2023 reported a \$433,000.00 loss compared to the previous year, a \$44,000.00 gain. Revenues for October are higher by \$226,000.00. Earnings on Deposits are much higher due to higher interest rates. Prop C is also higher this year due to higher funding levels. Expenses are up by \$700,000.00, mostly due to the one time returning teacher stipend which caused the Labor expenses to rise by \$610,000.00. Mr. Kemp went on to request that a motion be put on record to approve the audit after the auditor's presentation.

Operations Report

Chief Operating Officer, Mr. Stacy Graff began his report announcing his department's employee of the month is Mr. Ted Grable. Our ongoing projects are the building's Automation Systems which have been signed off by the UASF. CFO and the faiclites team are scheduled to meet with US Engineering on December 5, 2023 to discuss the installation date. These updates will take place during the winter break. The new system will control our new thermostats and HVAC units. We are also looking to add more Access Points provided through a grant this summer. The entire 1st-12th grades are now 1:1 for

chromebooks. The \$80,000.00 safety grant from DESE has been approved. With this grant we will purchase additional radios, 3 more AEDs, an EPI Pen station, protective window film for all entrance areas, and to update our technology software for cybersecurity. Winter sports and activities are well under way and very active with basketball tournaments, middle school will start their games next week, and wrestling and debate competitions. We're also working with the MLBA who provide grants for communities to help build baseball fields and equipment for schools. It is our hope to receive the \$40,000.00 grant for in field grass, dug outs, bleacher seating, foul poles, a pitching machine for practice, jersey's and equipment.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent, Mrs. Rebecca Gudde started her report sharing the 2015-2019 Stanford CREDO National Study comparing Charter schools to traditional public schools. UA showed approximately 59 days of growth in reading and 89 days of growth in mathematics as compared to other public and charter schools.

University Academy Foundation Report

UAF Executive Director, Mrs. Sonja Shaffer reported middle school held their camp information night (attendance required if applying to program) October 24, 2023. There were 31 families attending, and 2 via Zoom. Ms. Tracy Hull is working with the Cleaver YMCA to provide swimming lessons for camp applicants who don't know yet how to swim. Application deadline is November 29, 2023. Middle School also held a community service day on November 17, 2023 organized by Ms. Hull. Students first part of the day was used to clean the UA Adopt A Street area, and the second part was used to address and stamp birthday cards to send out to all alumni who were celebrating a birthday that month. Study Abroad information night (attendance required if applying to program) was held November 2, 2023. There were 22 families that attended, 4 attended the make up session via Zoom. On November 27, 2023, upper school students held the first ever Study Abroad Open House where the 2023 summer participants gave presentations about their summer travel experiences; where they went and what they did. Families and key donors were in attendance. For the Junior and Senior Seminar, Ms. Maya Tillmon and Ms. Hull, separately attend one senior seminar class each week to assist students with their college applications. Ms. Hull, who manages our Top 15 Scholarship program and mentors these students through college, is meeting weekly with students who are applying to Top 15 colleges or universities. For the summer 2024 Internship program we've had 36 alumni apply and 35 internships with the following companies; Children's Mercy Hospital, Helzberg Diamonds, Commerce Bank, American Century Investments, Lockton, DEMDACO, Essence of Australia, The Kansas City Zoo, and Murrell Homes. The All-Time Program Impact stats show 97% of former interns are either currently enrolled in college or have graduated, and 98% of Summer Internship Program participants who have graduated from college are employed full-time or in grad or trade school. The UAF is working with all alumni to provide career services. The goal is that 75% of college graduates who are not continuing to grad school secure a full-time position within 6 months after graduation. Those who do, are eligible for our new \$250 Start Your Life grant. Numbers show 83% of the December 2022 grads are employed, 56% of May 2023 graduates are currently employed full time in their career of choice, and 5 alumni will be graduating this December, one is already employed. On Nov. 6, 2023, we had 30 seniors help pack care packages for 56 alumni in college who applied to receive a care package. There were over 30 notes from teachers and more than 100 from seniors that were included in the packages. The UAF wants to support UA graduates who choose to not go to college by creating a program offering a cash award for those who enroll in and

graduate from a vocational or trade school program. Also for our college incentive program, we're requiring that all freshmen check in mid semester in order to receive the reward. To date everyone is still enrolled and doing good. Our last Monday Mixer was held November 13th with over 20 people attending. The majority were alumni. The first annual Alumni Awards Banquet will be held December 20, 2023 at Lula's Southern Cookhouse - 1617 Main St. This banquet will highlight alumni accomplishments and offer the opportunity for fellowship and engagement. UAF staff and the Alumni Council are jointly planning the event. The 2024 gala "Fore The Love of UA", will be held April 13, 2024. Honorary Chairs are Mr. and Mrs. David Dickey, Event Chair Mr. Byron White % 2004. Benefactor invitations will be mailed out today.

Background:

NOTE: DESE overpaid UA by \$747,000 in November 2023, and to correct this UA's December payment was decreased by that same amount. Per discussion with DESE, this was a one time error.

Overall, December 2023 is showing a \$302,784 loss in comparison to the December 2022 loss of \$515,140. The December 2023 revenue level is higher by \$1,024,557 from the December 2022 level (\$9,195,088 for December 2023 and \$8,170,531 for December 2022). The December 2023 expenditure level is higher by \$812,201 from the December 2022 level (\$9,497,872 for December 2023 and \$8,685,671 for December 2022).

Revenue:

The revenue is higher this year in comparison to FY 2023 by \$1,024,557.

Board Report Chief Operating Officer January 23rd, 2024

- The Employee of the Month for December is George Jefferson- US Counselor. Mr. Jefferson has been instrumental in helping shape the culture in the US for students and staff. George not only dedicates his time to the counseling position, but also helps work afterschool and weekend events for our tech team for outside renters. For January, the Employee of the Month is Don Jones, custodial services. Mr. Jones has been with us for 5 months now. Don is a retired veteran of the Navy and works outside of school through his church to help those in need. Don is a valued member of our custodial services team and we appreciate his dedication!
- Projects ongoing- The Building Automation System will be underway within the month as we continue to look for times they can work in the building without disturbing instruction. US Engineering is our vendor for this project. We have also established an Environmental Graphics Committee that will look at the aesthetic options to continue enhancing and promoting people of color who have had an immense impact on Kansas City or the nation to promote throughout the building. Our goal is to make sure our students and staff see the impact that just one person may have on our community.
- Safety Grant- We are currently in the process of finalizing orders for the safety grant that
 includes protective window film, AED's, Radios, and additional software for cybersecurity. We
 were awarded \$80,000 on this grant request. So far we have the AED's installed, Window film
 installed and all other items are in the ordering/delivery process.
- Baseball Diamond Grant- Helzberg Diamond at Swope Park: In September, Coach Gardner and Mr. Gresham brought me information on a grant possibility for improving our baseball field that we work cooperatively with KC Parks and Rec to maintain. I applied for the grant and we were notified we received the grant over winter break. Rebecca and Katie have signed off on the grant agreement.
 - As a reminder- We applied for \$40,000+ worth of field improvements including a grass infield, improved dugouts, backstop upgrades, bleacher seating, foul poles and a pitching machine for practice. They are also looking at providing some additional equipment and uniforms. We specifically requested honorary Jackie Robinson 42 jerseys for special memorial games in his honor. We will work through the final details in the next few weeks and hope to initiate these projects before Spring Break.
- The weather has been tricky as of late with this major cold front that moved through. The
 building has functioned well through this stretch and our grounds crew has worked hard to help
 manage our lots and sidewalks. We continue to utilize R and R Landscaping, owned by
 alumni David Roseburr, for our lawn maintenance and snow removal contracts.

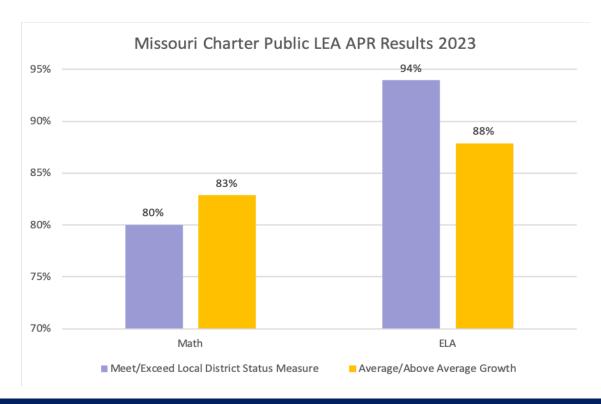


Understanding the Missouri Annual Performance Report (APR)

The Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP 6) is the state's current "accountability system for reviewing and accrediting Local Education Agencies (LEAs), outlines expectations for school practices and student outcomes." While local school districts are *accredited* and charter schools are instead *authorized*, we still earn and receive an Annual Performance Report (APR), based on Academic Achievement (Status and Growth), Success-Ready Students, Graduation Rate and Follow-Up, and all other Continuous Improvement measures. Most scores within the APR are classified in 3 or 4 categories (highest to lowest): Target, On-Track, Approaching, and Floor.

2023 APR Key Points for Missouri Charter Schools

- 1. The APR is a multi-pronged measure looking at a range of measures in performance and continuous improvement. A single APR percentage of points is rarely going to tell the story of the most important question: "how are the children?" We encourage anyone to dig into the data. With that said, 91% of all Missouri Charter Public School LEAs meet or exceed the local district's Academic Achievement Status Measure in Math or ELA.
- 2. Students in Missouri charter schools are demonstrating high rates of growth based on the 2023 APR.
 - Across Missouri's student group growth measure (growth for students who are Black, Latino/Hispanic, low-income, special education, and limited English proficient), a total of 24 LEAs in the state are above average in ELA and 32 in math. Of those, 8 are charter in each of ELA and math. This means that 1/3 of LEAs in ELA and 1/4 of all LEAs in math with above average growth for student groups are charter schools, yet charter schools are less than 10% of all LEAs and just 3% of all public-school enrollment.
 - This finding is a continuation of the finding by CREDO (Stanford research study, 2023), which showed charter students in Missouri receive 39.3 additional days of learning in reading and 56.1 additional days of learning in math, in a single school year, compared to other Missouri schools.
- 3. The APR data reveal that, like much of the rest of the state and country, we have much work to do to support our students and families.
 - The unweighted, flat average percentage of students scoring proficient and advanced in ELA for all charter schools is 28% and for math is 24%. While these are improvements compared to last year and surpass the district averages in both Kansas City (22% and 21% in ELA and math) and St. Louis (21% and 16%), they are not to pre-pandemic levels and show that we have much work to do to support our students.
 - Only 5 out of the 37 charters earned points in attendance in the APR. While attendance is itself
 an input, it is a critical variable that impacts the ability of the student to access educational
 content.



Academic Achievement

The APR contains *Status* and *Growth* measures of academic achievement, which are based on scores from the Missouri Assessment Program (MAP). LEAs are held accountable in the APR for Status and Growth measures for *all students* and students specifically identified as belonging to a combined "student group."

Status is a measure of academic performance at a given point in time. 32/35 Missouri charter LEAs meet or exceed the local district's status measure performance in Math and/or ELA.

Status and Growth by the Region – Kansas City

- In Math, 3/21 charter schools in Kansas City scored in the two highest Status categories *On Track* and *Target*. 11 more meet the performance of Kansas City Public Schools *Approaching*.
- Five Kansas City charter LEAs demonstrated *Above Average* growth in Math for the Student Group, and 11 demonstrated *Average* growth, while Kansas City Public Schools demonstrated *Below Average* growth.
- Of the 20 charter LEAs in Kansas City with sufficient data in ELA, one is at *Target*, and 17 are *Approaching*.
- Seven are *Above Average* in growth and 11 are *Average*.
- In English Language Arts, Kansas City Public Schools is *Approaching* in performance and *Below Average* in growth for all students. 5 of 20 charter LEAs are *Above Average* and 12 *Average*.

Status and Growth by the Region – St. Louis

- Of the 14 charter LEAs in St. Louis with sufficient data to report, two are *On Track* or at *Target* in Math and 11 are *Approaching*.
- St. Louis Public schools is at the *Floor* in Math performance and is *Above Average* in Math growth for all students.
- 3 of 14 charter LEAs demonstrated above average growth, and 10 average, in Math.
- In ELA, four of thirteen with data are *On Track* or at *Target* and nine are *Approaching*. Five are *Above Average* for growth and 6 are *Average*.
- In English Language Arts, St. Louis Public Schools is *Approaching* in performance and *Above Average* in growth.

Additional Measures

The **Success-Ready Students** measure evaluates students' readiness for the next phase of their educational experience." This includes a score for College and Career Readiness Assessments (including the ACT, SAT, and similar exams) and a score for Advanced Credit, like AP or Dual Credit courses.

The APR's **Graduation Rate** measure is designed to ensure LEAs "are supporting students to and through their high school graduation."

Graduation Follow-Up "measures the extent to which [graduates] pursue gainful opportunities after graduation." Scores in this measure are based on graduates pursuing "college enrollment, trade/technical school, employment, military service, and/or National or Community Service or Peace Corps.

A substantial portion of the APR score is calculated based on "Continuous Improvement" measures that reflect:

- an LEA's compliance with the required annual data collection and submission cycles
- an LEA's administration of Kindergarten Entry Assessments and creation of Individual Career and Academic Plans
- an LEA's attendance score (a complex calculation that factors in the "adjusted proportional weight" of individual student attendance rates
- compliance with additional administrative requirements

Charter LEAs and local districts are held accountable to various combinations of these additional measures, depending on grade span, length of time in existence, and other factors. This variation causes disparities in the weight that each section has on an overall APR percentage score. Of the 37 charter LEAs and their host districts, there are 16 different total scores and combinations, ranging from 48 points to 192. In other words, not all APR scores are apples-to-apples.

On the Measure of Attendance...

For over ten years, attendance initiatives promoted by Missouri's Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), have focused on 90% of students attending school 90% of the time. In the state's school finance formula, the emphasis is on the Average Daily Attendance (ADA) in a school building – more simply, the percentage of students present throughout each day during their enrollment. In MSIP 6, "The student's attendance rate is determined by using the "hours of absence" method. This method is calculated by dividing the hours of attendance by the total hours enrolled, then multiplying by 100 and rounding to the tenth. When calculating the LEA or school attendance rate, the proportional weight of each student is used. The proportional enrollment is determined by taking the total hours enrolled in the LEA or school and dividing by the total calendar hours rounded to the thousandth."

Like all schools, charter schools emphasize the importance of attendance for student outcomes. The complex calculations in the APR do not represent the full story of attendance for any school or district. Most importantly, the data does not reflect any indication that attendance is hindering student growth in charter schools. In fact, LEAs and districts with fewer attendance points outperform those with more attendance points on student growth measures in several ways. For example, 16% of LEAs/districts with zero APR attendance points have Above Average growth in Math in the Student Group. Similarly, 15% of LEAs/districts with zero APR attendance points have above average subgroup growth in ELA. For both subjects, this is a higher percentage of schools achieving above average growth than those with 50% of attendance points, 75% of attendance points and 100% of attendance points combined.

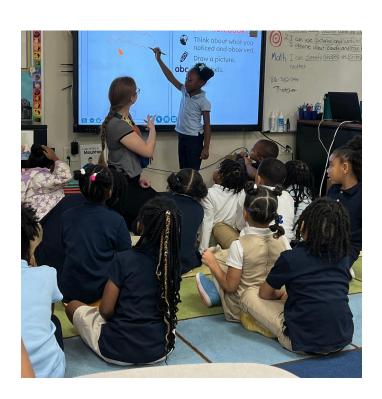

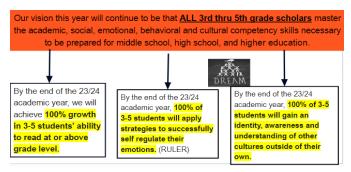




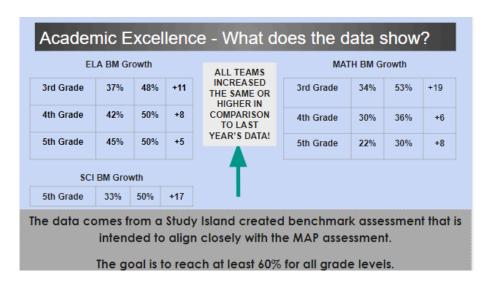
Lower School November Board Report, Grades 3-5

STUDENTS

The **3-5 Vision** referenced in the chart below includes an emphasis on high academic achievement in reading. The focus is that each of our students will show 100% growth in their ability to read at or above grade level. In addition, we recognize that our students also need the skills to self regulate their emotions and develop a sense of cultural awareness.



Benchmark Data Growth: The data chart below shows our students' current academic growth from August to January according to the Study Island benchmarks. As you can see, every grade level increased their average scores from BM 1 to BM 2, which means students scored higher and mastered more concepts between the baseline and second assessment. In addition, all grade levels performed the same or higher in comparison to the overall average scores this time last year.

We had growth in all 4 core classes on our Benchmark assessments. We like for students to be around 50% at this time of the school year as teachers have taught approximately 50% of the curriculum. We are on track for ELA, and Social Studies. We are not hitting marks in Science and Math. While we have seen growth from the Math department, we are short of where we would like to be. We are continuing to utilize IXL to help hone in on those specific Math Skills that students struggle with. We are also incorporating additional Math support within the school day to help close the gaps through a program called Ignite. Teachers are continuing to provide additional resources and support through tutoring, Saturday School, YUP program, and the utilization of Advisory Time.

Awards Assembly

On January 8th, Middle School held an awards assembly to recognize those students that made Principal's Honor Roll/Honor Roll for Quarter 2. In order for a student to make the Principal's Honor Roll students must maintain a combination of scores that average out to 3.5 or higher with NO '2'. Board of Director Bylaws

Article II Section 2. Number

The number of directors of the corporation **shall be** seven (7); provided, however, that the number of directors may at any time and from time to time be increased to any number not more than ten (10) and decreased to any number not less than three (3), by the adoption of a resolution to such effect or by an affirmative vote of a majority of the directors in office.

Article II Section 4. Election and Term of Office

Perpetual Directors: Three members of the Board of Directors <u>shall be</u> elected for three-year terms, with each director being eligible <u>to serve an unlimited number of terms</u>. The perpetual directors shall be Barnett C. Helzberg, Jr., Shirley Bush Helzberg and Bush C. Helzberg. In the event of the death, resignation or removal of a perpetual director, <u>a successor perpetual director shall be elected by a majority vote of the entire Board of Directors</u>.

Non-Perpetual Directors: The remaining four directors of the Corporation **shall be** elected for three-year terms, with each director being eligible to serve no more than two consecutive full terms.

Commencement of Term, Election of Directors: The term of a director shall begin at the conclusion of the annual meeting at which such Board member is elected and terminate at the end of that member's term or upon the director's earlier death, resignation or removal. The members of the Board of Directors at each annual meeting shall have the voting rights to elect the Board of Directors whose term begins upon the adjournment of such meeting; and such directors, as electors, shall have the full power and authority to re-elect any, several or all of the directors to succeed themselves in office, subject to the above term limits. Vacancies may be filled or new offices created and filled at any meeting of the Board of Directors.

Article II Section 10. Removal; Vacancies

A director may be removed, with or without cause, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the directors then in office. In the event of the removal of a director, or in the event of the death or resignation of a director, a majority of the remaining directors may fill such vacancy or vacancies. A director elected to fill a vacancy shall serve as such until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors.
