

# FACE TEAM Strategic Goal

Develop a family liaison team with systems to support the physical, emotional and academic needs of KCIA families, with the goal of increasing family and student access to education.

# FACE Team Strategic Plan Objectives



## Strategic Plan Objective 1

The annual family interest and needs survey was administered to families by the FACE Team during quarter 1, August-October. Surveys were translated into families' native languages and responses were obtained via face to face meetings, telephone conversations and through a google forms link.

Questions focused on family interest in planned events, feedback for family involvement in academic activities, interest in participating in the KCIA Parent Advisory Committee and needs related to medical/dental/mental health family resources.

Ten parents indicated interest in being a representative for the KCIA Parent Advisory committee. A fall PAC meeting occurred in September and another meeting is planned for March. PAC representatives will have the opportunity to volunteer at upcoming family engagement events and the spring annual survey. (Objective 3)

One parent representative attended Parent Teacher Conferences and volunteered several hours helping parents with Infinite Campus logins. (Objective 3)


Indicate that they would definitely attend a cultural fair to learn with their children about the diverse cultures represented by KCIA families.

## Strategic Plan Objective 2

During the first quarter, August-October the FACE Team implemented three learning-focused family engagement events. These included Back to School Night in August, session 1 of the Let's Read Family Literacy program during October and November and Parent Teacher Conferences with Community Resource Fair during the last week of October.

Individual FACE Team reports (in the following slides) highlight the Community Resource Fair.

# Let's Read Family Literacy Program

The KCIA FACE Team partnered with Literacy KC to provide a learning-focused family engagement program during the first quarter of school. This session consisted of weekly 90 minute family literacy activities and dinner every Thursday. There was a large response from interested families during the sign up period. So many families expressed interest that FACE Team had to limit participation due to Literacy KC capacity. Families were placed on a waitlist and added to the program as other families dropped out. A core group of 10 families have consistently participated throughout session 1.

Each session featured a specific learning objective that the Literacy KC leader explained to parents. Literacy KC and KCIA program assistant then assisted parents with practicing the learning objective with their children. Families read a book together, did a craft activity together and then finished the afternoon with a dinner provided by American Dining. Session 1 will wrap up on Thursday, November 17.

A second session is planned for January and February, weather permitting and in accordance with Literacy KC capacity.
