Assessments Overview

Growth - to what extent is a student increasing her knowledge/skills over time?

- NWEA MAP for ELA, Math, and Science
 - Northwest Evaluation Association Measures of Academic Progress
 - Commonly used, nationally norm-referenced assessment
 - Fall and Spring
- STEP (Strategic Teaching and Evaluation of Progress) Reading Assessment
 - Rigorous and accurate reading assessment
 - Every 6-8 weeks

Proficiency - how is a student performing against the 5th grade standard?

- Interim Assessments in ELA and Math
 - Every 6-8 weeks
 - Aligned to CCSS (Common Core State Standards)*

* Note that KCGPA aligns instruction to the more rigorous Common Core rather than to the Missouri Learning Standards.

ELA Interim Assessment #1


KCGPA uses Achievement Network interim assessments. They are a best-in-class, CCSS-aligned benchmark administered four times per year.

Schools that are new to using Achievement Network interim assessments for ELA typically score at 15-20% proficient on their first interim assessment.

KCGPA students averaged 38% proficiency.


ELA Interim Assessment #1: Comparative Proficiency Scores

KCGPA (yellow) vs. Crossroads Academy Charter Schools. Crossroads has two 5th grade schools that serve students who typically begin with them in Kindergarten.

KCGPA (yellow) vs. Ewing Marion Kauffman School. EMKS starts at 5th grade and has the highest growth scores in MO.



Math Interim Assessment #1

KCGPA is part of a selective, national cohort of schools working with the Achievement First charter school network on math curriculum and teacher development.

KCGPA uses a common interim assessment with these schools.



- KCGPA serves a large number of students from Gordon Parks Elem and Kansas City 33 (KCPS).

Math Interim Assessment #1



- The "cut scores" established here align to the more rigorous CCSS (Common Core State Standards), rather than MLS (Missouri Learning Standards). They are roughly equivalent to Below Basic (red), Basic (orange), Proficient (blue), and Advanced (green).
- Our intent is to teach and assess at a higher bar of rigor than required by state standards.
- data, we are as of now unsure how much growth these scores represent for our students. These results are not surprising given the low levels of math proficiency we found in our diagnostic NWEA assessments.
- We will share additional comparative data and analysis as soon as it becomes available.
