- 1. February Enrollment Update New total: K-8: 366 students. Pre K: 20 and Virtual: 10 = 396

Evaluate Data February 2022

Math

Grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, & 8 showed growth in the month of February.

1st, 2nd and 8th grade for moving out of below basic on the February test

4th grade for showing DOUBLE-DIGIT growth (12%) on the February test.

6th grade decreased 2% from December to February in math and Kindergarten decreased 7% from Form B to Form C in math.

ELA

6th Grade had a 6% decrease from Dec - Feb 2nd, 5th and 8th had a increase of 3% with one 5th grade homeroom increasing 8%

The average of every grade level has moved from below basic to basic.
