Internship: Block 37- Spring session began March 28th POAC Succeed- Students are working in on-site locations. Block 37- Spring session began on March 28 th . Anticipate 40 students to participate in the program. (New programs – Sports training, Music Production, DJing, and Spoken Word)
 Arts Tech – 7 students have been participating regularly at Art Tech to focus on advocacy and social media promotion. This after-school internship is paid through Arts Tech. It is an extension of Block 37 that was started in December and runs until end of school year. Retreats Program – 8 students have been participating regularly with ReTreats at the ReStart Center. This program provides student with a Financial Literacy credit and a paid internship. Students make, sell and brand Dog Treats. This program is an extension of Block 37 and runs January to the end of the school year. Students will also
 People of All Colors Succeed – The class focusing on Soft Skills begins on March 8th. 9 students have been selected for the first cohort. Class will run for the month of April. Students will start on-location internships on April 5th. Students will obtain 40 internship hours each over the course of the pilot program.
